Amendments to the Constitution

Statement of Votes given in the County of Macomb and State of Michigan at the General Election held in said County on the Eighth day of November 1870 for and against the following proposed Amendments to the Constitution of said State Viz; An Amendment relative to allowing the Board of Supervisors of counties to raise Two thousand Dollars a year for the purpose of repairing and constructing public Buildings, highways or bridges to stand a Section 9 of Article 10 provided for by Joint Resolution No 411 approved April 5th 1869. Also an Amendment to the Constitution of this State in relation respectively to the Apportionment of Representatives to the Qualification of Electors, and to the Militia, to stand respectively as Sections 3 and 4 of Article 14; Section 1 of Article 7; and Section 1 of Article 17 provided for by Joint Resolution No 412 approved April 5th 1869.

Also an Amendment to the Constitution of this State relative to the Salaries of State Officers and Judges of the Circuit Court to stand as Section 1 of Article 9 provided for by Joint Resolution No 417, approved April 5th 1869.
